How a century-old campus landmark reveals the county's growth DNA.

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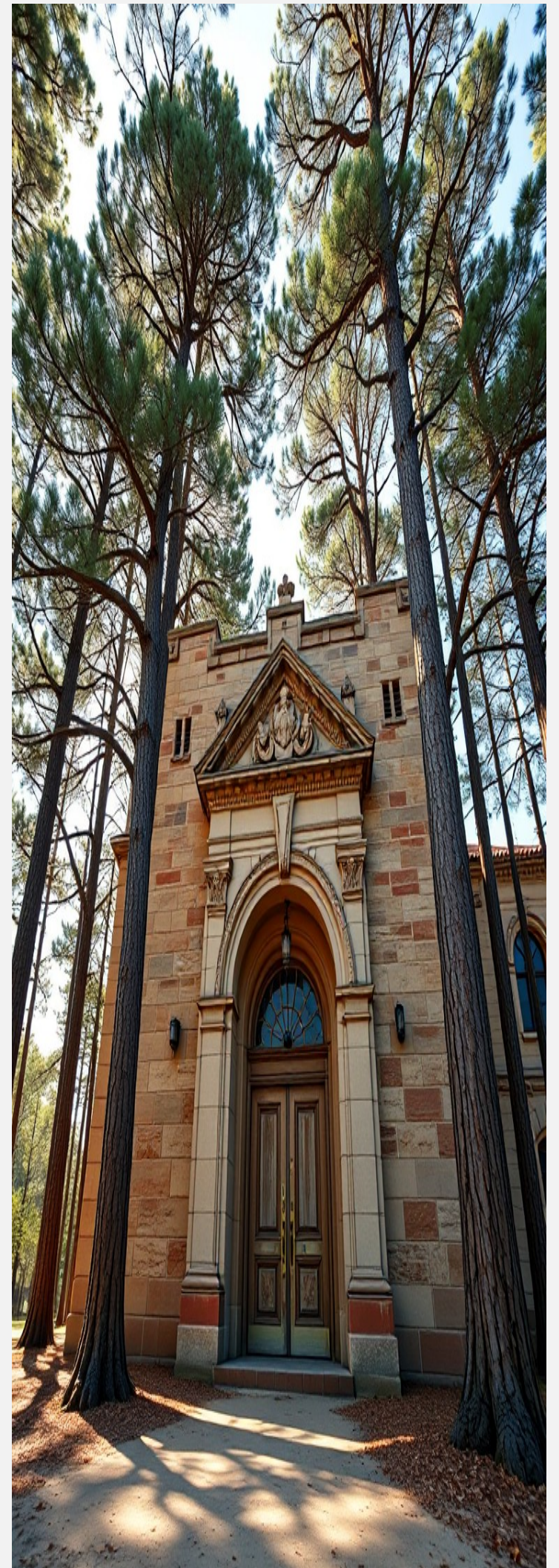
100 years
