Detectors in Ricochet Experiment

The number of neutrino detectors expanded from 2 to 18 during the experiment's evolution.

This exponential growth in instrumentation required not just technical scaling but human reconfiguration. As the detector count increased, the workload shifted from manual to automated, demanding deeper integration between physics and software engineering. The scale of the experiment became a test of team coordination as much as particle detection.

Trust Emerges from Repetition

The transition from manual to automated analysis wasn't driven by algorithmic superiority alone. It was catalyzed by the repetition of labor—faith in the process, not just the data. As Faith Reyes and her colleague developed a software framework to replace their own tasks, they weren't optimizing for speed; they were building a shared mental model of reliability. This is the true foundation of quantum-grade trust: not just error correction, but the recursive validation of human-machine collaboration.
