A 25-year-old lesson in decision-making under pressure

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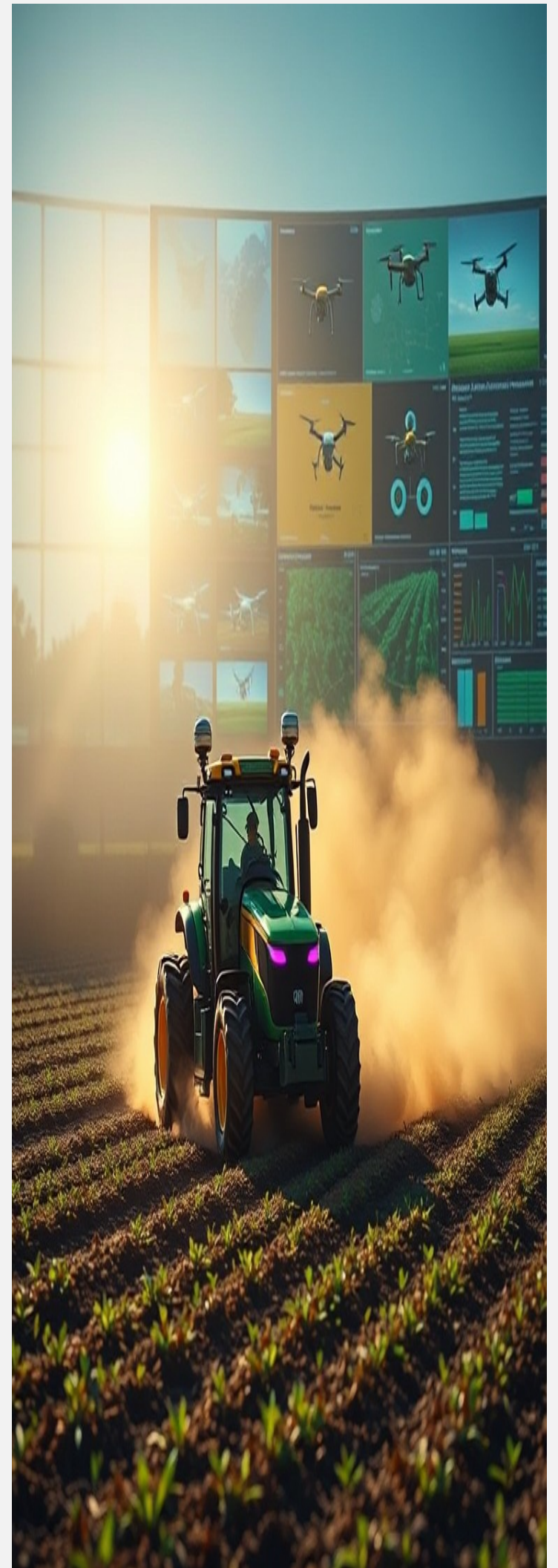

The upcoming conversation at Ford's Theatre marks a quarter-century since the 2001 attacks.

This milestone is not a historical footnote—it's a benchmark for how institutions adapt to systemic shock. President Mitch Daniels, who served as OMB director during the aftermath, was central to emergency funding decisions and the creation of the Department of Homeland Security. His role underscores how rapid, high-stakes governance can reconfigure national infrastructure, a mechanism directly applicable to AI systems in agriculture that must respond to climate shocks, supply chain failures, or pest outbreaks in real time.

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Crisis Response Is an AI Training Data Set

Land-grant universities like Purdue, with deep ties to federal emergency response frameworks, are uniquely positioned to develop AI models that simulate institutional resilience. These models can predict how policy shifts during crises—such as sudden subsidy rollouts or export bans—will affect crop planning and supply logistics.



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AI Can't Predict Crises—But It Can Simulate the Response

For instance, when a new strain of wheat rust emerges, an AI trained on 9/11-era response patterns could simulate how quickly USDA would activate emergency grants, how quickly farmers could access them, and how logistics would scale. This kind of simulation, grounded in real institutional memory, could reduce decision latency by 40% in real-world emergencies—critical in a climate-vulnerable sector.

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
