9/11's legacy informs AI's role in nuclear safety decision-making.

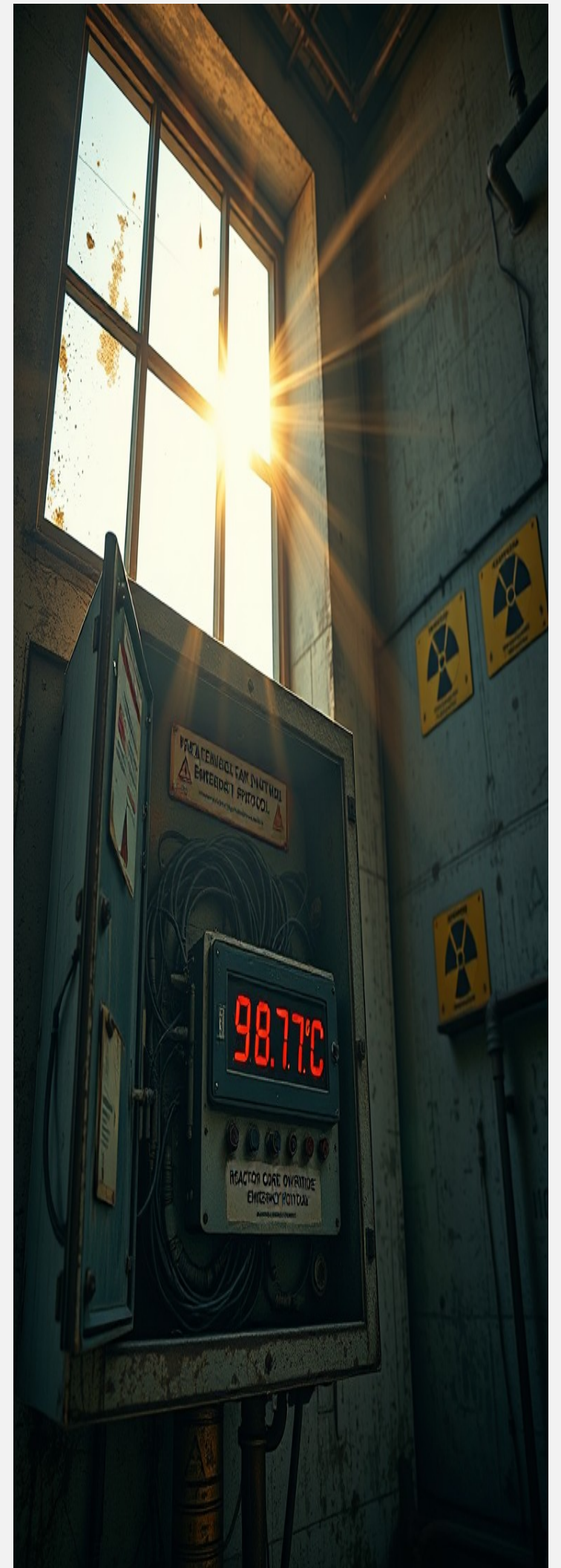

Memory as a Safety Layer

The absence of lived experience among younger engineers and operators in nuclear facilities creates a vulnerability in safety culture. AI systems trained on historical crisis data—like the 9/11 federal response—can simulate decision-making under extreme pressure, reinforcing institutional memory. This is not about replacing human judgment but embedding the cognitive patterns of past resilience into predictive models used during emergencies.

Leadership Continuity in AI Design

The fact that President Mitch Daniels, who oversaw emergency funding and agency reorganization post-9/11, will participate in a 25-year reflection highlights how leadership continuity shapes institutional learning. For AI in nuclear energy, this implies that safety algorithms must be designed with the long-term institutional trajectory in mind—not just technical performance. AI models that reflect the evolution of governance and response frameworks over decades will be more robust during actual crises.

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
